## **Club Descriptions and Clubber Expectations**



For 4 year olds (1 year before kindergarten)

- Bible lessons, memory verses and activities that teach basic truths about God, Jesus, sin and salvation.
- Clubbers must be able to follow directions
- Must be able to sit & listen for 20 minutes
- Parent stays if the child is not able to sit for 20 mn
- Use the bathroom independently
- Clubber expected to work with parent weekly on workbook and memory verse



For kids K-2<sup>nd</sup> grade

- Sparks ignites the curiosity of kids to learn about the people and events of the Bible, building a foundation of wisdom for knowing Christ.
- Clubbers will have regular opportunities to hear the gospel and come to have faith in Jesus Christ. .
- Child is 5 turning 6 in the fall or winter
- Expected to sit and listen\work for 15 minutes at a time
- Expected to memorize multiple verses and sections
- Parent help required in workbook
- Two or three helps only allowed in verse recitation



Grades 3-5 (8 turning 9 in the academic year to 11)

- T&T clubbers will learn the truth of God's Word, training them to follow Him in their daily lives
- Expected to sit and listen as directed by leaders
- Expected to memorize multiple full and/or larger verses and sections
- Expected to recite section reviews without stopping
- Parent help required in workbook
- One or two helps allowed in verse recitation



## Grades 6-8 (Middle School)

- Trek challenges students to wrestle with important questions by allowing them to dive deep into Scriptures, learning to own their faith and discover what they believe.
- Expected to sit and listen as directed by leaders
- Expected to complete daily verse reading and answer daily discussion questions prior to
- club night (written answers in workbook)
- Expected to memorize multiple full and/or larger verses and sections
- Expected to complete Bible book reviews
- Expected to recite section reviews of seven verses without stopping
- One help allowed per verse recitation

## **JGURNEY**<sup>M</sup>

Grades 9-12

- Journey establishes high school students as lifelong disciples through a deep study of God's Word, mobilizing them to live with godly perspective and evident faith.
- Expected to complete daily reading and written work in the workbook along with weekly memory verses
- Expected to complete Bible book reviews
- Expected to participate in service projects throughout the year
