The more important something is, the more sin will distort it The more wonderful something is, the more sin will abuse it

Danger: the lies our culture tells

- Sex, marriage and babies are separate
- Pornography is harmless

Protections: the truth of God

- Sex is good in one way Hebrews 13:4, I Thessalonians 4:3-5, I Corinthians 7:1-4
 - o I Thessalonians 4:3-5 It is God's will that you should be sanctified: that you should avoid sexual immorality; that each of you should learn to control your own body^[a] in a way that is holy and honorable, not in passionate lust like the pagans, who do not know God; and that in this matter no one should wrong or take advantage of a brother or sister.
- Sex creates life Genesis 4:1, Psalm 139:13-16
- Sex is more than intercourse
 - Matthew 5:27-29 "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall not commit adultery.' But I tell you that anyone who looks at a woman lustfully has already committed adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye causes you to stumble, gouge it out and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one part of your body than for your whole body to be thrown into hell.
- Sex is powerful I Corinthians 6:12-20

Questions and considerations:

- Consider or discuss how seriously Jesus addressed the topic of sexual issues.
- The departure from the restraints that God ordained for sexuality has resulted in much pain and trouble. Consider the ways this is reflected in our culture.
