The Trial - Sanhedrin

- Judgment had already been made

“The chief priests and the whole Sanhedrin were looking for false evidence against Jesus so that they could put him to death.”

-Matthew 26:59

The Trial - Sanhedrin

- Legal Standard – Two Witnesses

“On the testimony of two or three witnesses a man shall be put to death, but no one shall be put to death on the testimony of only one witness.”

-Deuteronomy 17:6

The Trial - Sanhedrin

- Witnesses Weren't Aligning

“Many testified falsely against him, but their testimony did not agree.”

-Mark 14:56

The Trial - Sanhedrin

- Jesus Testified Against Himself

“They all asked him, ‘Are you then the Son of God?’ He replied, ‘You are right in saying that I am.’ Then they said, ‘Why do we need any more testimony? We have heard it from his own lips.’”

- Jesus Condemned Himself

- Objective Judge Declared Jesus Innocent

- Political Considerations Trumped Justice
