Family Matters

Rebekah - Disrespected Her Husband

- Disregarded his desires for Esau
- Manipulated him for her own ends
- Made a fool out of him

God's Plan, God's Way

Isaac:

- Focus on God's promise to him
- Felt Esau was natural choice
- Tried to make it happen

Rebekah:

- Focus on God's prophecy to her
- Felt Jacob was Godly choice
- Tried to make it happen

Isaac and Rebekah:

- Combine promise and prophecy
- Set aside their preferences
- Ask God how to make it happen
