- Sad, emotionally spent
- Still didn't understand who Jesus was
- Hopes seemed dead

Luke 24:25-27

- Jesus chastises them
- Calls himself "Christ"
- Explained the Scripture

Luke 24:28-32

- Longing to stay with Jesus
- Jesus ate with them
- Jesus not constrained by space
- Emotionally and intellectually stirred

Luke 24:33-35

- Motivated to action
- Wanted to be with others like minded

Luke 24:36-46

Repeats the whole thing

- Jesus comes to all, not just a few
- Resurrection body
- •Important to know Jesus mission
