Joshua – What is his role?

Joshua 1:1-2,6-9

- He was born to lead
- God sought him because of his faith

Joshua 5:13-15, 6:1-7

He receives direct instruction from the Lord
 He gives that instruction to Israel

Israel – What do they do?

Joshua 6:8-21

- Listen carefully to instruction
- Entire army obeyed command to march
 Incredibly disciplined

Rahab – What did she do?

Joshua 2: 1-7, 8-10, 12-13

- Rahab hides the Israelite spies
- She fears God and recognizes His authority over creation
- She wants to be part of God's people

Matthew 1

- Rahab is an ancestor to Jesus' earthly bloodline
- Through Rahab kings would be born
- God had a plan for Rahab

 Rahab was one of the first people who lived in the promised land to be redeemed through Israel
